

Museum Manners and Camper Responsibilities

Dear Hunter Museum Campers,

Everyone at the Hunter Museum is looking forward to spending a fun, creative time with you this summer. Here is information to prepare you for your camp experience:

A typical camp day:

9 a.m.	Check your camper in with the camp counselor. Camp counselors may be in the museum lobby or out on the museum sculpture plaza at the front of the museum. You may park in the museum lot while dropping off your camper.
9 a.m. – 12 p.m.	Art making and other activities
10:30 a.m.	Campers are provided with a healthy snack and juice or water.
12 p.m. – 1 p.m.	Campers go to lunch with instructor and counselors. If the weather is nice campers will have lunch and play games in a local park. <i>The Hunter Museum does not provide lunch to campers.</i>
1 p.m. – 4 p.m.	Art making and other activities
2:30 p.m.	Campers are provided with a healthy snack and juice or water.
4 p.m.	Please pick up campers in the museum lobby and ensure that they are checked-out with a camp counselor.

* Call the museum immediately if your child is going to be late or absent from camp.

CAMPERS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE FOLLOWING THINGS:

- PACK A BAGGED LUNCH AND DRINK. Lunch is not provided by the Museum. Please make sure your camper has water (or another beverage) and a bagged lunch each day. We will provide snacks and drinks for the campers before and after lunch. *Also keep in mind that we are a peanut-free camp so please be sure not to send any peanuts, peanut butter or other peanut-related food with your child.*
- WEAR COMFORTABLE CLOTHES AND SHOES for walking around, inside and outside, the Museum. We will be working with a variety of materials, so wear art project clothes you will not mind getting messy!
- APPLY SUNSCREEN BEFORE LEAVING THE HOUSE and pack extra sunscreen to reapply later in the day.
- PACK A CHANGE OF CLOTHES & TOWEL in case you get wet at one of the local fountains.

MUSEUM MANNERS

1. PLEASE DO NOT RUN OR PUSH. Not only could you injure yourself or another person, but you could accidentally bump into a piece of art and damage it.
2. PLEASE DO NOT TOUCH THE ARTWORK. It is tempting to touch works of art, especially sculpture, but the natural oil on your fingers causes stains that damage the works.
3. PLEASE DO NOT CLIMB ON THE SCULPTURE. Large pieces of sculpture may look fun to play on but they are works of art that can be damaged.
4. PLEASE USE YOUR INSIDE VOICE. People visiting the museum enjoy looking at the art in a calm, quiet environment. Loud voices and stomping feet disturb other visitors.
5. PLEASE STAY WITH YOUR GROUP AT ALL TIMES. If you wander away from the group, you could get lost and miss the fun activities.
